Any person who practices medicine or surgery without being duly licensed and registered, as provided in this Article, shall 8 not be allowed to maintain any action to collect any fee for such services. Any person so practicing 9 without being duly licensed and registered in this State shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. 10 Any person so practicing without being duly licensed and registered in this State and who is falsely 11 representing himself or herself in a manner as being licensed or registered under this Article or 12 any Article of this Chapter shall be guilty of a Class I felony. Any person so practicing without 13 being duly licensed and registered in this State and who is an out-of-state practitioner shall be 14 guilty of a Class I felony. Any person who has a license or approval under this Article that is 15 inactive due solely to the failure to complete annual registration in a timely fashion as required by 16 this Article or any person who is licensed, registered, and practicing under any other Article of this 17 Chapter shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. 18
